

2016 Plenary Speaker: Dr. Dan Roby

Dr. Dan Roby is the Unit Leader for Wildlife at the U.S. Geological Survey and Oregon Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit. He is also Professor of Wildlife Ecology in the Department of Fisheries State University.

He holds degrees from Antioch College (BA), University of Alaska Fairbanks (MS), and University of Pennsylvania (PhD).



Dan has conducted research on the ecology of seabirds in Alaska, Hawaii, Greenland, Newfoundland, South Georgia, China, and Antarctica, as well as throughout the Pacific Northwest region of the U.S. His primary area of research interest is the physiological ecology and conservation biology of birds, with an emphasis on seabirds.

His recent research includes impacts of avian predation on recovery of ESA-listed salmonids in the Columbia River Basin, effects of the Exxon Valdez oil spill on seabirds in Alaska, seabird/fisheries interactions, effects of climate change on seabird populations at high latitudes, and restoration approaches for the critically endangered Chinese crested tern.
