

This comes from a recognition that the scientific study of birds and their conservation benefits from having shared conversations between members of these groups. All members of the symposium production team are volunteers who collectively donate hundreds of hours to make the symposium possible each year.

A note about our logo

This year, the logo for the Willamette Valley Bird Symposium consists of a Greater Sage-Grouse (*Centrocercus urophasianus*), a species of conservation concern that is native to the West. Due to an unprecedented collaboration effort among government agencies, non-government organizations, private landowners and other stakeholders, this species avoided a federal listing under the Endangered Species Act in 2015. The logo was created by Uta Briggs, an undergraduate in the Department of Fisheries and Wildlife at Oregon State University.
